Low levels of influenza-like illness activity


This survey was sent on Monday, 30 April 2018 at 01:13 AM and by 09:00 AM, Thursday 03 May we had received 30183 responses (last week) from 17625 people responding for themselves and 12558 household members across Australia.

Respondent Numbers by Jurisdiction

Across Australia, fever and cough was reported by 1.6% of vaccinated participants and 2.2% of unvaccinated participants. Fever, cough and absence from normal duties was reported by 0.9% of vaccinated participants and 1.3% of unvaccinated participants.

For participants this week, 7104/30183 (23.5 %) have received the seasonal vaccine so far. Of the 5204 participants who identified as working face-to-face with patients, 1484 (28.5%) have received the vaccine.
