Week ending 14 April 2019

Low levels of influenza-like illness activity

(Current low numbers of participants in NZ could prevent Flutracking from providing a representative picture in NZ. Care should be taken when interpreting this report. Note: FluTracking began earlier this year compared to 2018.)

This survey was sent on Monday, 15 April 2019 at 03:01 a.m. and by 09:00 a.m., Thursday 18 April we had received 3601 responses (3403 last week) from 1997 people responding for themselves and 1604 household members across New Zealand.



Across New Zealand, fever and cough was reported by 0.9% of vaccinated participants and 2.1% of unvaccinated participants. Fever, cough and absence from normal duties was reported by 0.5% of vaccinated participants and 1.5% of unvaccinated participants.

For participants this week, 923/3601 (25.6 %) have received the seasonal vaccine so far. Of the 474 participants who identified as working face-to-face with patients, 211 (44.5%) have received the vaccine.
