Week ending 15 September 2019

Low levels of influenza-like illness activity

(Current low numbers of participants in NZ could prevent Flutracking from providing a representative picture in NZ. Care should be taken when interpreting this report)

This survey was sent on Monday, 16 September 2019 at 03:01 a.m. and by 09:00 a.m., Thursday 19 September we had received 4066 responses (4226 last week) from 2295 people responding for themselves and 1771 household members across New Zealand.



Across New Zealand, fever and cough was reported by 1.6% of vaccinated participants and 2.5% of unvaccinated participants. Fever, cough and absence from normal duties was reported by 1.4% of vaccinated participants and 2.0% of unvaccinated participants.

For participants this week, 2791/4066 (68.6 %) have received the seasonal vaccine so far. Of the 543 participants who identified as working face-to-face with patients, 472 (86.9%) have received the vaccine.
