



# FluTracking Weekly Interim Report New Zealand

**Week ending 5 July 2020**

## Low levels of Influenza-like illness (ILI) activity

(FluTracking is an online **self-reporting** ILI surveillance system. Care should be taken when interpreting this report)

This survey was sent on Monday, 06 July 2020 at 03:01 am and by 09:00 am, Thursday 09 July we had received 52636 responses (54952 last week) from 26595 people responding for themselves and 26041 household members across New Zealand.


Across New Zealand, fever and cough was reported by 0.7% participants. Fever, cough and absence from normal duties was reported by 0.5% participants. Fever and cough was reported by 1.9% of participants aged less than 5 years, 1.1% of participants aged 5-17 years, 0.7% of participants aged 18-64 years, and 0.2% of participants aged 65 years or older.


