

# Weekly Interim Report New Zealand

**Week ending 14 November 2021**

**Low levels of influenza-like illness activity**  
**(FluTracking is an online self-reporting ILI surveillance system.**  
**Care should be taken when interpreting this report)**

This survey was sent on Monday, 15 November 2021 at 01:11 am and by 10:00 am, Thursday 18 November we had received 28500 responses (30061 last week) from 16491 people responding for themselves and 12009 household members across New Zealand.

Across New Zealand, Fever AND Cough was reported by 0.4% participants. Fever, cough and absence from normal duties was reported by 0.3% participants.

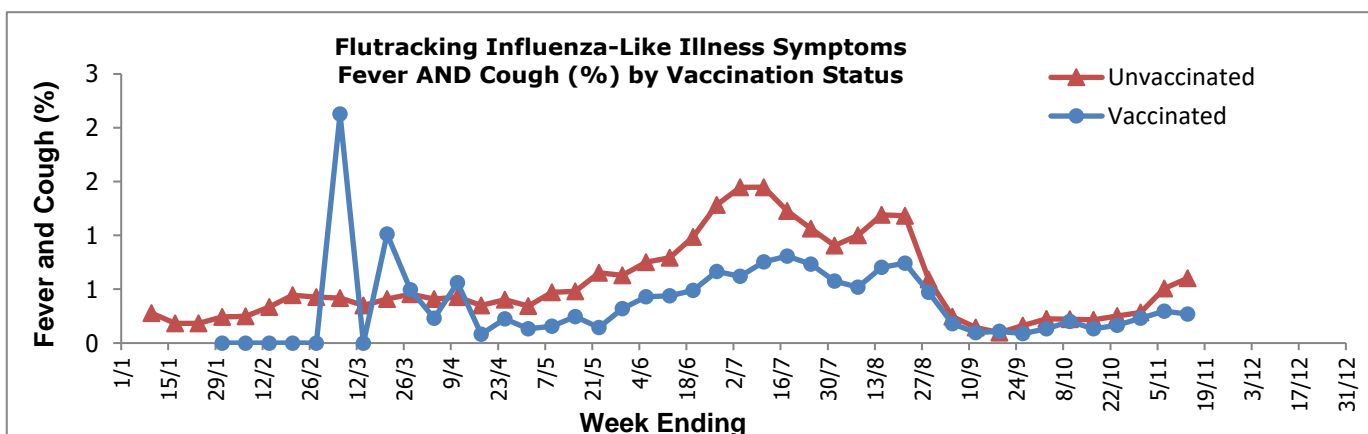
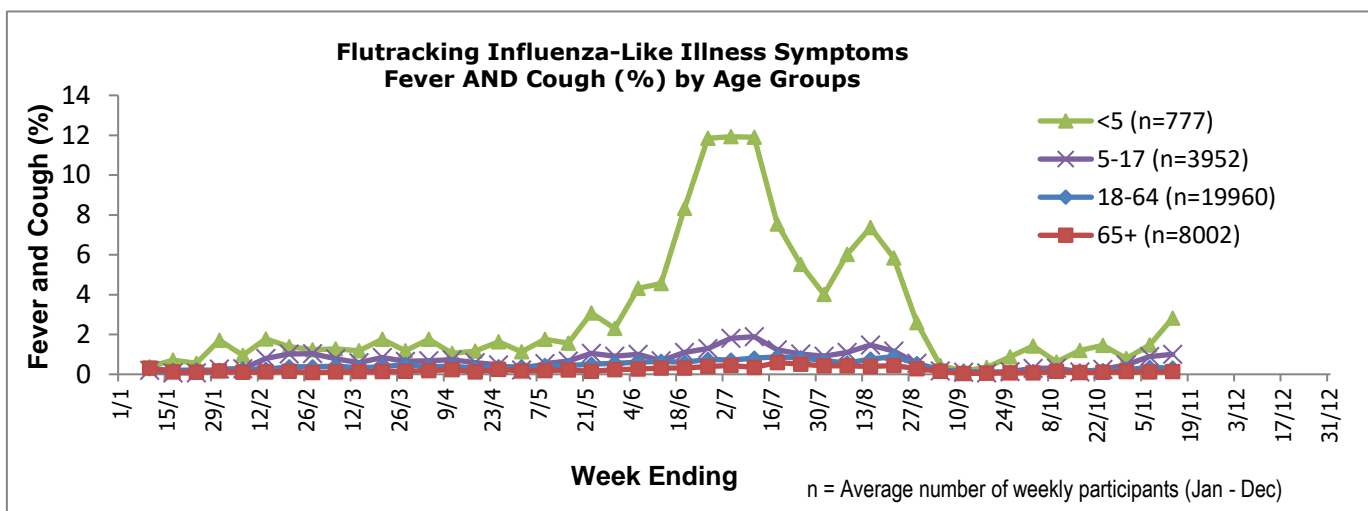
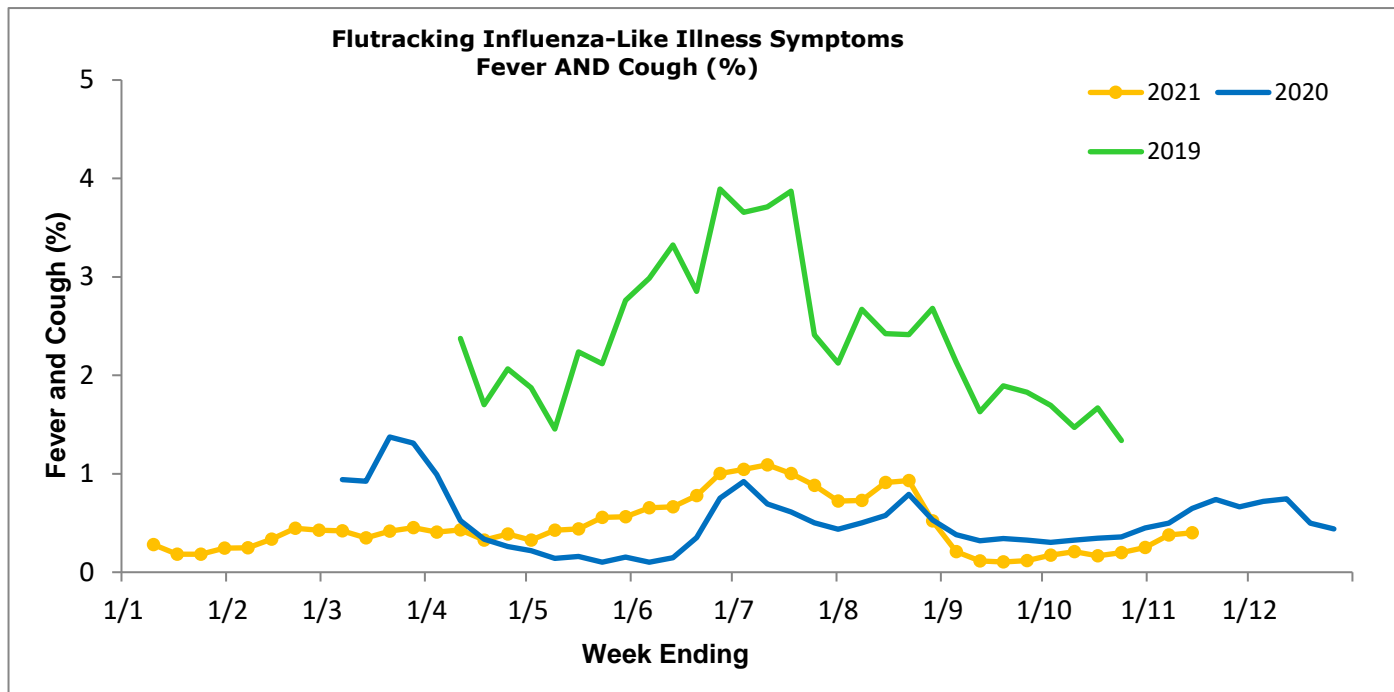
Fever AND cough was reported by 2.8% of participants aged less than 5 years, 1.0% of participants aged 5-17 years, 0.3% of participants aged 18-64 years, and 0.1% of participants aged 65 years or older.
