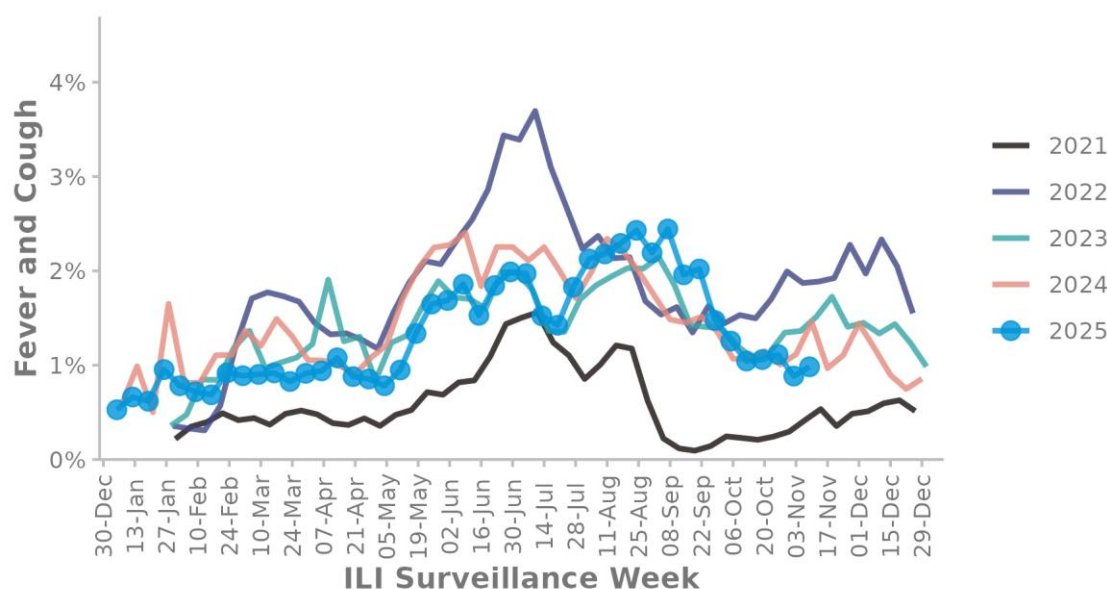

Low levels of respiratory illness activity. Fever, cough and absence from normal duties was reported by 0.7% participants

FIGURE 1. FLUTRACKING FEVER AND COUGH SYMPTOMS



This survey was sent in the early hours of 10 November 2025 and by 13 November 2025 11:30 am we had received 28,641 responses (29,009 last week) from 18,851 people responding for themselves and 9,790 household members across New Zealand.

Across New Zealand, fever AND cough was reported by 1% of participants. Fever, cough and absence from normal duties was reported by 0.7% participants. Fever AND cough was reported by 1.7% of participants aged less than 5 years, 1.5% of participants aged 5-19 years, 0.8% of participants aged 20-64 years, and 0.4% of participants aged 65 years or older.

The incidence calculation has recently been updated. Numbers from this report will currently not match incidence on the [New Zealand Influenza Intelligence Report](#). The data presented here should not be treated as authoritative and should always be interpreted together with other trusted sources from the [New Zealand Influenza Intelligence Report](#)

FIGURE 2. FLUTRACKING FEVER AND COUGH SYMPTOMS BY AGE GROUP

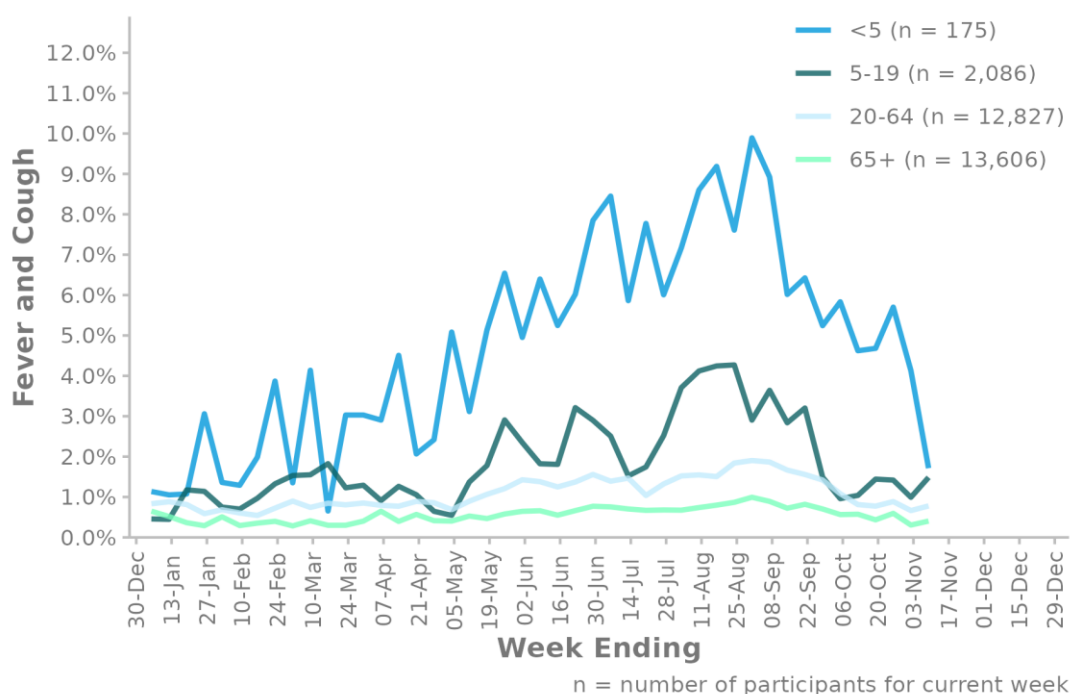
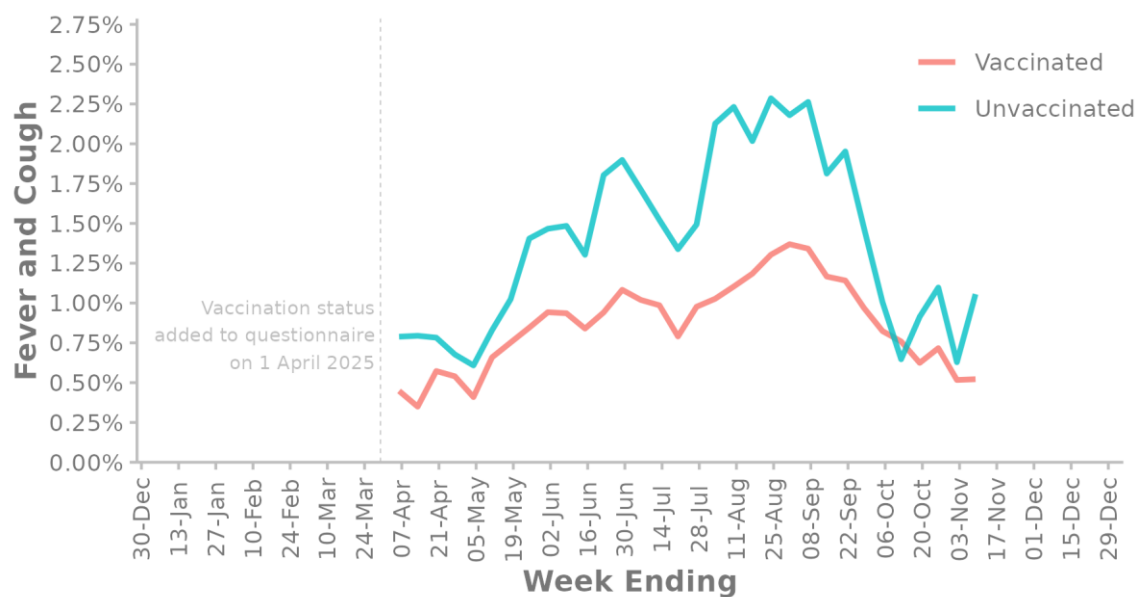


FIGURE 3. FLUTRACKING FEVER AND COUGH SYMPTOMS BY INFLUENZA VACCINATION STATUS
